

Jean Nouvel designs a new Campusea student residence in La Défense

At the heart of the Rose de Cherbourg urban development project in the Paris La Défense business district, Méka Brunel, Gecina's Chief Executive Officer and Director, Patrick Devedjian, Member of Parliament for Hauts-de-Seine and President of Defacto, Jean-Claude Gaillot, CEO of EPADESA, and Jean Nouvel, Architect, laid the foundation stone for an outstanding student residence.

Developed by Gecina and designed by Ateliers Jean Nouvel, this 400-bed residence will be opening for the start of the 2018 academic year. It will offer a varied selection of accommodation to rent, from studios to shared apartments, with a range of services created specifically with students' needs in mind: lounge, cafeteria, laundry, fitness room, etc. The construction of the 10,468 sq.m building over 20 floors has been entrusted to the Spie Batignolles group and is targeting an exemplary environmental profile with NF HQE Habitat (Excellent) and BREEAM (Very Good) certification.

Located in Puteaux, next to the Boulevard Circulaire ring road, this future residence is part of the Rose de Cherbourg development project looking to create a vibrant city district through a mixed program combining offices, retail space and housing. The public spaces project, led by EPADESA and designed by the Barcelona-based agency Arriola & Fiol, plans to transform a highway interchange into a "sky garden" set aside for walking, sports and community life.

"I am particularly proud to lay the foundation stone for this Campuséa residence, which will be truly iconic thanks to its outstanding scale, location and architectural features. Through this investment, Gecina is contributing to the Rose de Cherbourg urban regeneration project led by EPADESA", explains Méka Brunel.

Jean-Claude Gaillot, EPADESA's CEO, confirmed his delight: "The development of a residential program for students on this scale is a clear sign of Paris La Défense's commitment to building a stronger presence for students and higher education in this business district. By 2020, Rose de Cherbourg will be a fully reconfigured neighborhood in which students, employees and residents will be able to enjoy a range of new public facilities, extensive parks and gardens, and a direct link to Puteaux".

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EPADESA: Key player for Greater Paris

EPADESA, the Public Development Authority for La Défense Seine Arche, manages urban planning for La Défense Seine Arche and initiates innovative consultation-based development programs.
